Dear Friends,

As this new year of 2023 progresses our entire Diocese will be moving forward with the Road to Renewal process which has been in the planning and pilot stages for a couple years. The largest practical steps in the process, and those which will be profound in our experience, will take place during this year. It will be a time of needed adjustments, a time of growth and newness, and, I believe, ultimately a time of great blessings.

As was listed in the bulletin last week, Bishop Mike has appointed eight priests to serve as Vicars Forane for seven geographical regions, called Vicariates, and one non-territorial Vicariate for College and University Campus Ministry. Our Vicariate is the Southern Tier West Vicariate. The Vicar Forane for our region is Fr. Todd Remick. Fr. Todd's primary responsibility will be to serve as a link between the Bishop and the groupings of parishes, called Families of Parishes, of our Vicariate. Fr. Todd will assist the Families of Parishes by ensuring our collaboration and functioning accords with diocesan plans and, we pray, is very fruitful.

There are four Families of Parishes in our Vicariate. Each Family of Parishes consists of 3-6 parishes. Some of these parishes, however, have multiple worship sites (e.g., Blessed Mary Angela Parish has two worship sites: St. Hyacinth and St. Hedwig). Thus, each of the Families of Parishes in our Vicariate has 5-8 worship sites or Church buildings. Each Church site may also have former school buildings, convents, active rectories, cemeteries, etc.

Our Family of Parishes consists of the following Parishes (and worship sites):

1. St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, Dunkirk
2. Bl. Mary Angela, Dunkirk (St. Hyacinth & St. Hedwig sites)
3. Holy Trinity, Dunkirk
4. St. Joseph, Fredonia
5. St. Anthony, Fredonia
6. Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Silver Creek (OLMC site in Silver Creek & St. Rose of Lima site in Forestville)

Thus, our Family has six Parishes and eight worship sites. Our Family also includes a significant number of cemeteries and numerous other buildings. Moreover, the Northern Chautauqua Catholic School (NCCS) is serving within this community as well.

The other three Families of Parishes in our Vicariate are comprised of Parishes in the following locations:

1. Jamestown/Falconer/Lakewood/Randolph
2. Mayville/Bemus Point/Westfield/Brocton/French Creek/Sherman
3. Gowanda/Cattaraugus/Langford/N. Collins/Eden

Each Family of Parishes will either have: (a) one priest appointed as the pastor and a specific number of other priests appointed as parochial vicars - this is called the One Pastor model; (b) a group of priests who serve the Family of Parishes "In Solidum", in which case all the priests jointly share the typical responsibilities

of a pastor, with one priest serving as moderator of the group - this is called the In Solidum model. Deacons also will be assigned to serve in each Family. We anticipate that these decisions and assignments will be made over the course of the coming weeks and months.

A date will soon be determined for our Family to begin the six-month process in which we will first plan and then begin to operate as a Family of Parishes. Based on the information we have received from the Diocese, we tentatively anticipate that our community will begin the process sometime between May and July, though no start date has been set at this point. The process begins with what is called an Initiation Phase. This phase will be a time of planning and forming a Strategic Plan for operating as a Family of Parishes. After the six month Initiation Phase, we will enter the Activation Phase, which will involve the implementation of that plan, and our full operation as a Family of Parishes.

The Initiation Phase will involve groups of representatives (laity, parish staff, and clergy) from each Parish in our Family working together to develop strategic plans according to six areas or "Pillars" of Parish life. These Pillars are: (1) Liturgy/Mass times; (2) Spiritual Life; (3) Forming Disciples; (4) Outreach/Inreach; (5) Stewardship; and (6) Administration.

During the early phases of this process, each Family of Parishes will also participate together in programs of spiritual renewal, including a great program entitled, Life In The Eucharist, among others. It will be the goal of our Family to bring our Parishes to pray, grow and serve together, live as one Catholic community, and bring the Light of Jesus Christ to all the people in all the communities of our area.

Friends, this effort will involve a great deal of prayer, flexibility, mutual support, hope, charity, and faith. At times it may feel like many things are changing, as indeed, perhaps many things will be different. And in the same moment, the central realities of our faith, Sacramental, and spiritual life aren't going to change at all. As we read in the Letter to the Hebrews, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever." (Heb. 13:8) God is faithful, and in response to His goodness we can all continue to strive and support one another in being faithful to Him and to each other. God is always doing something ... something new and something wonderful. Let us seek to renew together our confidence in Him!

Queridos amigos,

A medida que avanza este nuevo año de 2023, toda nuestra Diócesis avanzará con el proceso Camino a la Renovación que ha estado en las etapas de planificación y piloto durante un par de años. Los pasos prácticos más grandes del proceso, y los que serán profundos en nuestra experiencia, se darán durante este año. Será un tiempo de ajustes necesarios, un tiempo de crecimiento y novedad y, creo, en última instancia, un tiempo de grandes bendiciones.

Como se mencionó en el boletín de la semana pasada, el obispo Mike ha designado a ocho sacerdotes para que sirvan como vicarios foráneos para siete regiones geográficas, llamadas vicariatos, y un vicariato no territorial para el ministerio en campus universitarios y universitarios. Nuestro Vicariato es el Vicariato del Nivel Sur Oeste. El Vicario Foráneo de nuestra región es el P. Todd Remick. Padre La responsabilidad principal de Todd será servir como enlace entre el Obispo y las agrupaciones de parroquias, llamadas Familias de Parroquias, de nuestro Vicariato. Padre Todd ayudará a las Familias de las Parroquias asegurando nuestra colaboración y acuerdo de funcionamiento con los planes diocesanos y, oramos, sea muy fructífero.

Hay cuatro Familias de Parroquias en nuestro Vicariato. Cada Familia de Parroquias consta de 3-6 parroquias. Algunas de estas parroquias, sin embargo, tienen múltiples lugares de culto (p. ej., la Parroquia Beata María Ángela tiene dos lugares de culto: St. Hyacinth y St. Hedwig). Por lo tanto, cada una de las Familias de Parroquias en nuestro Vicariato tiene de 5 a 8 lugares de culto o edificios de la Iglesia. Cada sitio de la Iglesia también puede tener antiguos edificios escolares, conventos, rectorías activas, cementerios, etc.

Nuestra Familia de Parroquias consta de las siguientes Parroquias (y sitios con templos):

1. Santa Elizabeth Ann Seton, Dunkirk
 2. B. Mary Angela, Dunkirk (sitios de St. Hyacinth y St. Hedwig)
 3. Santísima Trinidad, Dunkirk
 4. San José, Fredonia
 5. San Antonio, Fredonia
 6. Nuestra Señora del Monte Carmelo, Silver Creek (sitios de NSMC en Silver Creek y de St. Rose of Lima en Forestville)
- Así, nuestra Familia cuenta con seis Parroquias y ocho templos. Nuestra Familia también incluye un número significativo de cementerios y numerosos otros edificios. Además, la Escuela Católica Northern Chautauqua (NCCS) también está sirviendo dentro de esta comunidad.
- Las otras tres Familias de Parroquias en nuestro Vicariato están compuestas por Parroquias en los siguientes lugares:
1. Jamestown/Falconer/Lakewood/Randolph
 2. Mayville/Bemus/Westfield/Brocton/French Creek/Sherman
 3. Gowanda/Cattaraugus/Langford/N. Collins/Edén

Cada Familia de Parroquias tendrá: (a) un sacerdote designado como párroco y un número específico de otros sacerdotes designados como vicarios parroquiales - esto se llama el modelo de Un Pastor; (b) un grupo de sacerdotes que sirven a la Familia de Parroquias "In Solidum", en cuyo caso todos los sacerdotes comparten conjuntamente las responsabilidades típicas de un pastor, con un sacerdote sirviendo como moderador del grupo - esto se llama el modelo In Solidum. También se asignarán diáconos para servir en cada Familia. Anticipamos que estas decisiones y asignaciones se tomarán en el transcurso de las próximas semanas y meses.

Pronto se determinará una fecha para que nuestra Familia comience el proceso de seis meses en el que primero planificaremos y luego comenzaremos a operar como una Familia de Parroquias. Con base en la información que hemos recibido de la Diócesis, anticipamos tentativamente que nuestra comunidad comenzará el proceso en algún momento entre mayo y julio, aunque no se ha establecido una fecha de inicio en este momento. El proceso comienza con lo que se llama una Fase de Iniciación. Esta fase será un tiempo de planificación y formación de un Plan Estratégico para operar como una Familia de Parroquias. Después de la Fase de Iniciación de seis meses, entraremos en la Fase de Activación, que involucrará la implementación de ese plan y nuestra operación completa como Familia de Parroquias.

La Fase de Iniciación involucrará a grupos de representantes (laicos, personal parroquial y clérigos) de cada Parroquia de nuestra Familia trabajando juntos para desarrollar planes estratégicos de acuerdo a seis áreas o "Pilares" de la vida Parroquial. Estos Pilares son: (1) Liturgia/Horarios de Misa; (2) Vida Espiritual; (3) Formando Discípulos; (4) Alcance externo e interno; (5) Mayordomía; y (6) Administración.

Durante las primeras fases de este proceso, cada Familia de Parroquias también participará en programas de renovación espiritual, incluyendo un gran programa titulado, Vida en la Eucaristía, entre otros. Será el objetivo de nuestra Familia llevar a nuestras Parroquias a orar, crecer y servir juntas, vivir como una comunidad Católica y llevar la Luz de Jesucristo a todos las comunidades de nuestra área.

Y en el mismo momento, las realidades centrales de nuestra fe, vida sacramental y espiritual no van a cambiar en absoluto. Como leemos en la Carta a los Hebreos, "**Jesucristo es el mismo ayer, hoy y por los siglos**". (Heb. 13:8) Dios es fiel, y en respuesta a Su bondad todos podemos continuar esforzándonos y apoyándonos unos a otros para ser fieles a Él y unos a otros. Dios siempre está haciendo algo ... algo nuevo y algo maravilloso. ¡Busquemos renovar juntos nuestra confianza en Él!
