Sacred Heart Church: From St. Mary's to Sacred Heart to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton - 1857 to 1975

A part of St. Mary's history includes the establishment of Sacred Heart of Jesus community. Prior to 1857, the few German Catholic families living in Dunkirk worshipped at St. Mary's Church. On August 16, 1857, they met with Rev. James Nagel C.S.S.R. of Buffalo, who encouraged them to build a church of their own. A lot was purchased on Ruggles Street for \$300 and the erection of a frame church was begun at once. It was completed the following year and dedicated in honor of St. George on February 15, 1858, by Rev. W. Deiter of St. Louis Church, located in Buffalo, NY. The size of the church's edifice was 70 feet long by 35 feet wide, and cost \$1,693.00. The first trustees were George Dotterweich, F. A. Peter, Leonard Frey, John Buscher and George Uschold, and the membership consisted of about 37 families. Some of the other charter members of the parish were Andrew Dotterweich, Jacob Stahler, Joseph Scheyer, Vincent Bohn, Jacob Mehs, Frank Braun, Peter Hansen, etc.

The little parish was first attended by priests from the Franciscan Monastery at Allegany, N. Y. by Rev. Dominic Geymer, who came here every two weeks to celebrate Mass. According to the records, the first baptism took place on February 20, 1858 and the child baptized was Barbara Guenther; the first marriage was that of Vincent Bohn and Dorothy Stahler on May 7, 1858; the first death recorded is that of Vitus Rau, February 28, 1858. The next 16 years were rather unsettled. Father Geymer remained until 1859 and was relieved by Rev. J. N. Arent, who resided in Hamburg, N. Y. and he also came here every two weeks until November 1860, when he was replaced by Rev. Andrew Pfeifer, O.F.M. from Allegany, who continued until June 1862. In March, 1863, Rev. Luke Bandinelli, C.P. gave the first mission in the church and then the Passionist Fathers, who had charge of St. Mary's since 1860, also took charge of our parish with Rev. Frederiek Lang, C.P. in attendance from February 1863 to December 1866.

Jesuit Fathers from Buffalo came every Sunday until November 18, 1874 when Rev. Ferdinand Kolb was appointed the first resident pastor. Soon after his arrival, the question of building a new church was again in the planning stages. George Dotterweich bought a large house and lot on Railroad Avenue where the present school stands and deeded it to the congregation for a parochial residence. Up to that time, Father Kolb boarded at a private residence. The Church of The Sacred Heart of Jesus was dedicated, having an estimated cost of \$20,000. It is an admirable architectural design and the furnishings superb.

The generous George Dotterweich, who had assisted so liberally in the building of both St. Mary and Sacred Heart churches, paid for the town clock in the steeple, the chime of bells, and donated a \$5,000 marble altar, which was consecrated on July 23, 1882. Mr. Dotterweich died in April 1884, and left a bequest of \$4,000 towards the erection of a school house adjoining the church.

Sacred Heart was a brick Victorian Gothic building with a tall spire capping its facade tower. In the late 1950's it was refaced and remodeled and given a somewhat less lofty colonial-style cupola. The church was located at the corner of Main and Ruggles Street in Dunkirk. Behind it was St. George's School (1884) with the front facing Franklin Ave.

Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón: De Santa María al Sagrado Corazón a Santa Elizabeth Ann Seton - 1857 a 1975

Una parte de la historia de Santa María incluye el establecimiento de la comunidad del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús. Antes de 1857, las pocas familias católicas alemanas que vivían en Dunkerque celebraban su culto en la iglesia de Santa María. El 16 de agosto de 1857, se reunieron con el reverendo James Nagel C.S.S.R. de Buffalo, quien les animó a construir una iglesia propia. Compraron un terreno en la calle Ruggles por 300 dólares y empezaron a construir una iglesia. Fue terminada al año siguiente y dedicada en honor de San Jorge el 15 de febrero de 1858 por el reverendo W. Deiter de la iglesia de San Luis, situada en Buffalo, Nueva York. El tamaño del edificio de la iglesia era de 70 pies de largo por 35 pies de ancho, y costó \$1,693.00. Los primeros fideicomisarios fueron George Dotterweich, F. A. Peter, Leonard Frey, John Buscher y George Uschold, y los miembros eran unas 37 familias. Otros miembros fundadores de la parroquia fueron Andrew Dotterweich, Jacob Stahler, Joseph Scheyer, Vincent Bohn, Jacob Mehs, Frank Braun, Peter Hansen, etc.

La pequeña parroquia fue atendida por primera vez por sacerdotes del monasterio franciscano de Allegany, N. Y. por el reverendo Dominic Geymer, que venía cada dos semanas a celebrar misa. Según los registros, el primer bautismo tuvo lugar el 20 de febrero de 1858 y la niña bautizada fue Barbara Guenther; el primer matrimonio fue el de Vincent Bohn y Dorothy Stahler el 7 de mayo de 1858; la primera muerte registrada es la de Vitus Rau, el 28 de febrero de 1858. Los 16 años siguientes fueron bastante inestables. El Padre Geymer permaneció hasta 1859 y fue relevado por el Rev. J. N. Arent, que residía en Hamburg, N. Y. y también vino aquí cada dos semanas hasta noviembre de 1860, cuando fue reemplazado por el Rev. Andrew Pfeifer, O.F.M. de Allegany, que continuó hasta junio de 1862. En marzo de 1863, el Rev. Luke Bandinelli, C.P. dio la primera misión en la iglesia y luego los Padres Pasionistas, que habían estado a cargo de St. Mary's desde 1860, también se hicieron cargo de nuestra parroquia con el Rev. F'rederiek Lang, C.P. desde febrero de 1863 hasta diciembre de 1866.

Los padres jesuitas de Buffalo venían todos los domingos hasta el 18 de noviembre de 1874, cuando el reverendo Ferdinand Kolb fue nombrado primer párroco residente. Poco después de su llegada, la cuestión de la construcción de una nueva iglesia estaba de nuevo en las etapas de planificación. George Dotterweich compró una casa grande y un lote en Railroad Avenue, donde se encuentra la escuela actual, y lo cedió a la congregación para una residencia parroquial. Hasta entonces, el padre Kolb se alojaba en una residencia privada. La Iglesia del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús fue dedicada, con un costo estimado de \$20,000 dólares. El diseño arquitectónico es admirable y el mobiliario magnífico.

El generoso George Dotterweich, que había colaborado tan generosamente en la construcción de las iglesias de Santa María y del Sagrado Corazón, pagó el reloj municipal del campanario, el carillón de campanas y donó un altar de mármol de 5.000 dólares, que fue consagrado el 23 de julio de 1882. El Sr. Dotterweich murió en abril de 1884 y dejó un legado de 4.000 dólares para la construcción de una escuela contigua a la iglesia.

El Sagrado Corazón era un edificio gótico victoriano de ladrillo con una alta aguja coronando la torre de su fachada. A finales de la década de 1950 se remodeló y se le dotó de una cúpula de estilo colonial algo menos elevada. La iglesia estaba situada en la esquina de las calles Main y Ruggles de Dunkerque. Detrás estaba la escuela St George (1884), cuya fachada daba a la avenida Franklin.
