A Message from Fr. Mark

Thanks to each of you for being a part of our Parish Community! Since I arrived here 10 weeks ago, I think we've made some good progress in getting our parish operations up to speed with where we want to be and in the daily work of evangelization. So many things are in process, but here's a short list of some of the things we've accomplished in recent weeks:

Our Parish was four years behind on providing annual financial reports to the Diocese. Those are now completed for all past fiscal years. The report for the financial year the just ended on August 31 should be complete and in to the Diocese by early November. We will then be current on these reports, which is essential for our Parish.

1. We have restarted regular meetings (monthly) of the Parish Finance Council.
2. Put in place a check requisition process for parish purchasing.
3. Begun our annual religious education program with nearly double the number of children and youth participating.
4. Offered the Anointing to the sick after weekend Masses and currently celebrating special Masses for healing in both English and Spanish.
5. Appropriately adjusted our weekday Mass schedule.
6. Thanks to the kindness of a small group of parishioners, begun a parish Garden club!
7. Begun the RCIA process in Spanish in a new fashion.
8. For security purposes, we installed a new key system.
9. This will be a long process, but we have begun to clean and clear out a lot of old, unused clutter from our buildings.
10. Updated our Parish computers in a very cost effective and efficient way – all through the generosity of two anonymous parishioners.
11. We updated and completed the annual lease agreement with NCCS Regional School with in an effective manner. And we are strengthening our Parish's connection with NCCS School.

12. Restructured our weekend collection process to involve one passing of the basket during Mass, with limited exceptions for second collections of extra importance.
13. Created a new and effective process for receiving and depositing Parish receipts that come in through avenues other than the weekend collection (e.g., Mass intentions, other receipts, memorials, etc.).
14. Re-instituted the ordinary liturgical roles of the Deacon.
15. Created a new bulletin layout.
16. We've begun including more Spanish in our bulletin.
17. We are expanding our focus on ministering to the Hispanic Community here in Dunkirk.
18. We are looking forward to the celebration of Confirmation for four young men in our Parish next Saturday!
19. And, finally, we are working together to keep our focus as a community on Jesus Christ, who is truly present in the Most Holy Eucharist.

There's much more also! I hope you enjoy being a part of our parish community. Let's keep working together to strengthen and grow our parish in peace and holiness.

Un mensaje del P. Marcos

¡Gracias a cada uno de ustedes por ser parte de nuestra Comunidad Parroquial! Desde que llegué aquí, hace 10 semanas, creo que hemos logrado un buen progreso en poner nuestras operaciones parroquiales al día con el lugar donde queremos estar y en el trabajo diario de evangelización. Muchas cosas están en proceso, pero aquí hay una breve lista de 20 cosas que hemos logrado en las últimas semanas:

1. Nuestra Parroquia se atrasó cuatro años en la entrega de informes financieros anuales a la Diócesis. Esos ahora están completos para todos los años fiscales anteriores. El informe del año fiscal que acaba de terminar el 31 de agosto debe estar completo y en la Diócesis en los primeros días de noviembre. Entonces habremos completado estos informes, lo cual es esencial para nuestra Parroquia.
2. Hemos reanudado las reuniones regulares (cada mes) del Consejo de Finanzas Parroquial.
3. Poner en marcha un proceso de solicitud de cheques para comprar cosas por la parroquia.
4. Comenzó nuestro programa anual de Educación Religiosa con casi el doble de participación de niños y jóvenes.
5. Ofrecí la Unción a los enfermos después de las Misas un fin de semana y ahorita estamos en proceso celebrar Misas especiales para sanación en inglés y en español.
6. Se ajustó el horario de misas de lunes a viernes de manera adecuada.
7. ¡Gracias a la amabilidad de un pequeño grupo de feligreses, comenzó un club parroquial de jardinería!
8. Comenzó el proceso RICA en español de una nueva manera.
9. Por motivos de seguridad, instalamos un nuevo sistema de llaves.
10. Este será un proceso largo, pero hemos comenzado a limpiar y eliminar una gran cantidad de desorden viejo y sin usar de nuestros edificios.
11. Actualizamos las computadoras de nuestra parroquia de una manera muy razonable y eficiente, todo gracias a la generosidad de dos feligreses anónimos.
12. Actualizamos y completamos el contrato de arrendamiento anual con la Escuela Regional NCCS de manera efectiva. Y estamos fortaleciendo la conexión de nuestra parroquia con la escuela.
13. Se reestructuró nuestro proceso de recolección de fin de semana para involucrar un paso de la canasta durante la Misa, con excepciones limitadas para segundas colectas de importancia adicional.

14. Creó un proceso nuevo y eficaz para recibir y depositar los recibos parroquiales que llegan a través de vías distintas a las colectas de fin de semana (por ejemplo, intenciones de Misa, recibos de cementerio, memoriales, etc.).
15. Reestableció las funciones litúrgicas ordinarias del diácono.
16. Creó un nuevo diseño de boletín.
17. Hemos comenzado a incluir más español en nuestro boletín.
18. Estamos ampliando nuestro enfoque en ministrar a la comunidad hispana aquí en Dunkirk.
19. ¡Esperamos con ansias la celebración de la Confirmación de cuatro jóvenes de nuestra Parroquia el próximo sábado!
20. Y, finalmente, estamos trabajando juntos para mantener nuestro enfoque como comunidad en Jesucristo, quien está realmente presente en la Santísima Eucaristía.

¡Hay mucho más también! Espero que disfruten siendo parte de nuestra comunidad parroquial. Sigamos trabajando juntos para fortalecer y hacer crecer nuestra parroquia en paz y santidad.
