

Dear Friends,

Last week I mentioned four ideas to grow the Church. These ideas come from Bishop Robert Barron. I think they are excellent ideas - in particular the first one - and so I wanted to highlight them again here. I also added a fifth idea of my own. Here they are:

1. Every family or individual that comes regularly to mass should make it their evangelical responsibility to bring another family or person to Mass and into the life of the Church this year.
2. Every Catholic should be praying for the expansion of the Church. And to get specific, let's pray that our Parish would increase by 100% in the next year. Yes: One-Hundred Percent!
3. Welcome seekers to bring their doubts or questions.
4. Be kind and live with exemplary generosity!
5. Make confession a priority in our spiritual life. Which we can all do especially by making a good confession before Christmas.

Wouldn't it be amazing if every one of us in the Church brought at least one person back to the faith or into the Catholic Church in the next year! Is that possible? For sure it is. As the Angel Gabriel said to Mary: “Nothing is impossible for God!”

Did You Know?

The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy (CSL), one of the documents of Second Vatican Council calls for "full, conscious, and active" participation on the part of the laity. That means we're not supposed to be silent spectators at Mass. *"Christ's faithful, through a good understanding of the rites and prayers should take part in the sacred action, conscious of what they are doing, with devotion and full collaboration. Instructed by God's word, and nourished at the table of the Lord's Body, they should give thanks to God. Offering the immaculate victim, not only through the hands of the priest but also together with him, they should learn to offer themselves. Through Christ, the Mediator, they should be drawn day by day into ever more perfect union with God and each other, so that finally God may be all in all."* (Chp.2, #48, CSL)

We participate in the liturgy as members of the Body of Christ, just like a musician who participates in a symphonic orchestra. Musicians perfect their ability to play a particular instrument, study music, paying attention to the melodic ebbs and flows of the piece they are playing, rehearsing their part daily, and listening to other members of the orchestra and the parts they each play, all the while keeping an eye on the orchestra's conductor for cues when to play their part. As members of this Eucharistic community, we are to keep our focus on the ebb and flow of the liturgy, always ready to participate when cued to do so. But just as a musician prepares for a concert ahead of time, we must also prepare ourselves for Mass. Our rehearsal schedule could be spending time each week ahead of Sunday Mass reading and meditating on the Sunday readings; get involved in liturgical ministries as a lector, as an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, or in music ministry. Active participation means putting our hearts and minds and voices into the actions and movements of the liturgy – pray, listen, respond, and sing. And finally, come to Mass expecting to encounter our Lord Jesus Christ.
