Why did Jesus become Man?

In the creed we say: "For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven." In Jesus Christ, God reconciled the world to himself and redeemed mankind from the imprisonment in sin. "God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son." In Jesus, God took on our mortal human flesh, shared our earthly lot, our sufferings, and our death, and became like us in all things but sin. Simply put, Jesus became man to share our life and save us from sin and death.

What does it mean to say that Jesus is the "only-begotten Son of God"?

When Jesus calls himself "God's only-begotten Son" (or "only Son") and Peter and others bear witness to this, this expression means that of all human beings only Jesus is more than a man and has a unique relationship to God his Father.

In many passages in the New Testament Jesus is called "Son". At his Baptism and his Transfiguration, the voice from heaven calls Jesus, "my beloved Son". Jesus discloses to his disciples his unique relationship to his heavenly Father: "All things have been delivered to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, and no one knows the Father except the Son, and any one to whom the Son chooses to reveal him." The fact that Jesus Christ is really God's Son comes to light at the Resurrection. Jesus is fully God and fully man, he is Son of God and Son of man. The mystery of Jesus as God and Man is someone we come to know personally in prayer.

¿Sabes tu? (adaptado del YOUCAT)

Por qué Jesús se hizo Hombre? En el credo decimos: "Por nosotros los hombres y por nuestra salvación bajó del cielo". En Jesucristo, Dios ha reconciliado al mundo consigo y ha liberado a los hombres de la cautividad del pecado. "Porque Dios amo tanto al mundo, que entrego a su Hijo unico." En Jesús, Dios asumió nuestra carne humana mortal, compartió nuestra destino terrenal, nuestros sufrimientos y nuestra muerte, y se hizo en todo igual a nosotros, excepto en el pecado. En pocas palabras, Jesús se hizo hombre para compartir nuestra vida y salvarnos del pecado y la muerte.

¿Qué quiere decir "Jesús es el Hijo único de Dios"? Cuando Jesús se demonia a sí mismo "Hijo único de Dios" y así es testimoniado por Pedro y otros, se expresa con ello que entre todos los hombres sólo Jesús es más que un hombre y tiene una relación única con Dios, su Padre.

En muchos lugares del Nuevo Testamento se llama "Hijo" a Jesús. En su Bautismo y en su Transfiguración, un voz celestial designa a Jesús como "el Hijo amado". Jesús revela a sus discípulos su relación única con su Padre celestial: "Todo me ha sido dado por mi Padre, y nadie conoce al Hijo sino el Padre, así como nadie conoce al Padre sino el Hijo, y aquel a quien el Hijo se lo quiera revelar." El hecho de que Jesucristo es realmente el Hijo de Dios sale a la luz en la Resurrección. Jesús es plenamente Dios y plenamente hombre, es Hijo de Dios e Hijo del hombre. El misterio de Jesús como Dios y Hombre es algo y alguien a quien llegamos a conocer personalmente en la oración.

VEN, SENOR JESUS, VEN

Dear Friends,

In these final days before Christmas it can be helpful for us to try to find some extra time to remain quiet and to pray. Jesus' disciples said to Him, "Lord, teach us how to pray." And Jesus responded by giving them the prayer, "Our Father, who art in Heaven ...".

When we come to Church, or say grace before meals, or pray the rosary with someone else, these are all communal prayers. Our personal prayer life is something different, and so important to cultivate. It is so precious in living the Christian life. Personal prayer may involve offering spoken prayers in silence, and it can also involve simply the opening of the heart and mind to God without words. In this way, we can do many things. We could read some passages from the Bible and then quietly ponder on what we read. We could also look at a sacred image, for example a Nativity scene, and simply contemplate that mysterious event without any words. We can also simply go to a quiet place and direct our mind towards God in any way we choose. For example, we could picture God in our mind or a mystery from the life of Jesus and simply contemplate it. In these final days before Christmas—that is what I always do. Since I was a child, I simply try to silently and quietly accompany Mary and Joseph on the little road to Bethlehem, by spiritually and quietly uniting in my daily walk and journey with theirs. In that prayer, silence and contemplation ... I so often find the incredible grace and beauty of Bethlehem present and alive, as living encounter with the awesome mystery of the birth of our Savior.

Quando venimos a la Iglesia, o damos las gracias antes de las comidas, o rezamos el rosario con alguien más, todas estas son oraciones comunitarias. Nuestra vida de oración personal es algo diferente y muy importante de cultivar. Es tan precioso en vivir la vida cristiana. La oración personal puede implicar ofrecer oraciones habladas en silencio, y también puede implicar simplemente la apertura del corazón y la mente a Dios sin palabras. Por ejemplo, podríamos imaginarnos a Dios en nuestra mente o un misterio de la vida de Jesús y simplemente contemplarlo. En estos últimos días antes de Navidad, eso es lo que siempre hago. Desde niño, simplemente trato de acompañar en silencio y en silencio a María y José en el caminito de Belén, uniéndome espiritual y silenciosamente en mi caminar y camino diario con el de ellos. En esa oración, silencio y contemplación... Encuentro tan a menudo la increíble gracia y belleza de Belén presente y viva, como encuentro vivo con el misterio asombroso del nacimiento de nuestro Salvador.
